DAY 5 | 09 Nov, 2025

Accra - Canopy Walk Way & Kakum Rain Forest - Slave Dungeon Experience (Cape Coast Castle) [B/-/D]

Following your breakfast, begin your journey towards Cape Coast, passing through the historically significant Denkyira Kingdom, a region with a rich past. Continue onwards to Kakum National Park, a remarkable

testament to the preservation of West Africa's tropical rainforests. Here, you'll have the choice between two captivating activities. You can opt for a 2-kilometer nature walk through the lush rainforest, where you'll have the opportunity to encounter a diverse array of extraordinary plant and animal species and learn about their medicinal properties. Alternatively, you can embark on an exhilarating stroll along the canopy walkway, suspended 40 meters above the forest floor, offering breathtaking views.

After enjoying lunch at your own leisure, embark on a poignant tour of the infamous forts, castles, and slave dungeons that bear witness to Ghana's dark past. Unfold the pages of history as you delve into the harrowing story of the transatlantic slave trade, whose repercussions are still felt far beyond the African shores to this day. Your first stop will be the Cape Coast Castle, originally built by the Swedes in 1653 and later seized by the British. Here, you will gain insight into the intricate relationship between the Western slave traders and the African tribes that facilitated the transatlantic slave trade. Step inside the castle's dim and suffocating dungeons, and let your imagination transport you back in time, allowing you to empathize with the millions of Africans who endured unimaginable suffering. The castle also houses the West African Historical Museum, providing further historical context and artifacts for exploration.

Cape Coast - (Fishing Village Slave Dungeon (Elmina Castle]) [B/-/D]

Immerse yourself in the village's primary industry - fishing - as you engage with local fishermen, gaining insights into the intricacies of their trade and the daily challenges they face. Next, venture into the heart of the village and meet the fishmongers who play a vital role in the fishing community. Watch as they skillfully demonstrate the various stages of smoking fish in traditional

earthenware ovens. This immersive experience provides a fascinating glimpse into the age-old techniques employed in this important trade, showcasing the rich cultural heritage of the region.

After enjoying lunch at your leisure, proceed to explore Elmina Castle, also known as St. George's Castle, a profound historical landmark constructed by the Portuguese in 1482. Here, you will gain a deeper understanding of the complex relationship between Western slave traders and the African tribes involved in the trans-Atlantic slave trade. As you venture into the castle, you will witness the haunting dungeons where local individuals were once confined, enduring the oppressive conditions before embarking on the arduous and perilous journey across the Atlantic. The experience of witnessing these stark realities firsthand serves as a powerful reminder of the inhumane nature of the slave trade.

In the evening, join the group for a "kasa" session, a time for meaningful discussions and conversations. Overnight in Cape Coast

DAY 7 | 11 Nov, 2025

Cape Coast - (Elmina -Assin Manso Traditional Naming Ceremony- Kumasi) [B/-/D]

After breakfast, check out of your hotel at 8:00 AM and drive through the forest zone to Kumasi, the heart of the Ashanti Empire, to explore the rich legends of the Ashanti people, whose influence is still felt today. Along the way, stop at Assin Manso to visit the site of "Donkor Nsuo," the former Slave River and market, which served as the last transit point for many enslaved Africans. Here, you can also pay respects to two ancestors whose remains were returned from the USA and Jamaica and reburied at this site.

Assin Manso is deeply symbolic for many individuals looking to reconnect with their African roots. A ceremony takes place at the Slave River, where returnees are immersed in its waters, representing

their first bath upon returning to their ancestral homeland. They are then dressed in white garments and adorned with Yeyaa spiritual leaves. Libations are poured, and the returnees are welcomed at the palace by traditional chiefs. Following this, a naming ceremony occurs, where they receive local traditional names, celebrating their African heritage.

Next, you will make a courtesy visit to the chief and elders, accompanied by traditional drumming and dancing from the villagers. The group will participate in a naming ceremony, where each participant will receive a Ghanaian name and a gift, celebrating their new identity as a Ghanaian and a member of the local community. Then, continue your journey to Kumasi.

Overnight in Kumasi

DAY 8 | 12 Nov, 2025

Kumasi - (Ashanti Craft Villages) [B/-/D]

Following a satisfying breakfast set out from your hotel and dedicate the day to exploring three renowned craft villages of the Ashanti region. The first stop is Ahwiaa, a village known for its skilled wood carvers. Immerse yourself in the vibrant atmosphere as you witness the intricate process of creating African crafts from wood. Concluding the craft village tour, visit Bonwire, a village renowned for its expertise in Kente weaving. Witness the mesmerizing process of hand-weaving intricate and colorful Kente cloth, an art form deeply rooted in Ashanti tradition. Marvel at the dexterity and precision of the weavers as they bring vibrant patterns to life. This is an ideal opportunity to purchase authentic

Kente cloth directly from the weavers themselves, ensuring a unique and meaningful keepsake of your Ghanaian adventure.

Throughout the day, you will have the chance to not only observe the creative process but also support the local artisans by purchasing their crafts directly.
