Discover the traditional crafts of the region at the Kejetia Market, visit the Manhyia Palace Museum to learn about Ashanti history and traditions, and witness vibrant traditional ceremonies and rituals.

DAY 1 | 06 Oct, 2026

DAY 2 | 07 Oct, 2026

Accra Arrival [-/-/D]

Upon arrival in Accra, claim your bags and proceed toward the arrival hall. Our representative will meet you and assist you with your transfer to the hotel. (Standard check-in time is 3:00 pm).

Check-in at the hotel. Evening enjoy dinner at the hotel.

Overnight in Accra

DAY 3 | 08 Oct, 2026

Accra (City tour with visit to Traditional African Market) [B/-/D]

After enjoying your breakfast, embark on an informative sightseeing excursion of Accra, the capital city of Ghana. This orientation tour provides an opportunity to explore the highlights of Accra, a city that has served as Ghana's capital since 1877 and remains the bustling hub of the Greater Accra Region, as well as the country's most populous city.

Travel through the various districts of Accra, including the administrative and economic sectors, and witness the vibrant atmosphere that characterizes the city. Visit notable landmarks such as the Artiste Alliance Gallery, the W.E.B. Du Bois Center for Pan African Culture, and the Independence/Black Star Square. Gain insight into significant historical events in Ghana's history and the crucial role played by the country's first president in leading Ghana to independence.

Continue your tour with a visit to the National Museum of Ghana, situated in Accra. This museum, the largest and oldest among the six museums managed by the Ghana Museums and Monuments Board, was inaugurated on March 5th, 1957, as part of the nation's independence celebrations. Immerse yourself in Ghana's rich cultural heritage as you explore the exhibits within its walls.

Conclude the day's tour at the Arts Center, a vibrant open-air market where you can practice your bargaining skills while shopping for a wide array of goods sourced from Ghana and other West African countries. Marvel at the diverse selection of fabrics, showcasing different materials, designs, colors, and textures, offering you an opportunity to purchase unique pieces that catch your eye.

Later this evening enjoy dinner.

Overnight in Accra

DAY 4 | 09 Oct, 2026

Accra - Canopy Walk Way & Kakum Rain Forest Slave Dungeon Experience (Cape Coast Castle) [B/L/-]

After breakfast, check out of your hotel at 7:30AM and depart to Cape Coast. Upon arrival, drive through the historic Denkyira Kingdom to Kakum National Park, one of West Africa's surviving tropical rain forests. Choose between a 2 km nature walk through the rain forest to discover the wide variety of exotic flora and fauna species and the medicinal values they offer or take a walk on the canopy walkway hanging 40 meters above the forest ground.

After lunch, embark on a tour of the infamous Forts, Castles, and Slave Dungeons of Ghana. History will unfold the story of the slave trade which the impact is still felt beyond the shores of Africa today. Visit the Cape Coast Castle built by the Swedes in 1653 and was later taken over by the British. Here, you would learn about the relationship between the western slave traders and the African tribes that made the trans-Atlantic slave trade possible. It is an opportunity to be up and close with history - to stand in the dark and stuffy dungeons, imagining the experience and conditions that millions of Africans endured. This castle also houses the West African Historical Museum.

DAY 5 | 10 Oct, 2026

Cape Coast - (Fishing Village Slave Dungeon (Elmina Castle)) [B/-/D]

At 11:00AM, depart your hotel to explore Elmina, a fishing village that's both picturesque and gritty,

charming and thought-provoking. What better way to appreciate it than to immerse oneself in its main industry – fishing! Meet with local fishermen to learn the intricacies of their trade and the challenges they face in their day-to-day work. Next, meet the fish mongers in the village who will demonstrate the various stages of smoking the fish in earthenware ovens. This is a unique way to experience one of Ghana’s oldest and important trades.

After lunch on your own, visit Elmina Castle, also known as St. George’s Castle, which was built by the Portuguese in 1482. Here, learn about the relationship between the western slave traders and the African tribes that participated in the trans-Atlantic slave trade. Here participants will witness the dark and stuffy dungeons local people were forced to endure before being sent on a long and perilous passage across the Atlantic. To see the truth of these conditions in person is a powerful reminder of the inhumanity of the slave trade.

Overnight in Cape Coast

DAY 6 | 11 Oct, 2026

Cape Coast -Day free at leisure [B/-/D]

Enjoy a **day at leisure in Cape Coast, Ghana**, a historic and culturally rich town nestled along the Atlantic coastline. This free day offers the perfect opportunity to explore at your own pace, whether you prefer to unwind, dive into local history, or immerse yourself in the vibrant culture of the region.

You might choose to **stroll along the palm-fringed beaches**, soaking in the warm sun and the soothing rhythm of the waves. For those interested in history, Cape Coast is home to **Cape Coast Castle**, a UNESCO World Heritage Site that played a significant role in the transatlantic slave trade. A self-guided or optional guided visit can provide powerful insights into Ghana’s past.

Alternatively, venture into the nearby town to experience **local markets**, taste **authentic Ghanaian cuisine**, or interact with friendly locals.

Whether you spend your day reflecting by the ocean, connecting with history, or enjoying the natural beauty of the region, a day at leisure in Cape Coast offers the flexibility to make your experience as relaxing or

enriching as you choose.

Overnight in Cape Coast

DAY 7 | 12 Oct, 2026

Elmina - Assin Manso - Traditional Naming Ceremony - Kumasi - (Ashanti Craft Villages) [B/-/D]

After breakfast, check out of your hotel at 8:00AM and drive through the forest zone to Kumasi, the seat of the Ashanti Empire to explore the legends of the famous Ashantis, whose legacies are still evident today. En route, stop at Assin Manso. Visit the site of “Donkor Nsuo”, the former Slave River and market, the final transit point for a large number of enslaved Africans. This is the final resting place for two ancestors whose mortal remains were returned from the USA and Jamaica and re-interred there.

Afterwards, you will pay a courtesy call on the chief and elders amidst traditional drumming and dancing by the villagers. The group will participate in a naming ceremony of recognition, where a Ghanaian name is given to participants, and a gift presented as part of celebrating a new identity as a Ghanaian and a member of the local community. Continue the drive to Kumasi.

Overnight in Kumasi

DAY 8 | 13 Oct, 2026

Kumasi - (Ashanti Craft Villages) [B/-/D]

After breakfast, depart your hotel at 9:30AM and devote this day to visiting the three famous Ashanti craft villages; Ahwiaa, the wood carvers’ village, Ntonso, the home of Adinkra cloth, and Bonwire, the Kente weaving village. You will have an opportunity to see how African crafts are made and to buy directly from the artisans who make them.

Overnight in Kumasi

DAY 9 | 14 Oct, 2026

Kumasi City Tour - Besease Shrine - Accra [B/-/-]

Following a delightful breakfast, complete the check-out process at your hotel and commence your journey back to Accra. Along the way, take a captivating detour to visit the renowned Besease Shrine, a designated World Heritage Site. Situated near the town of Ejisu,

this traditional fetish shrine holds deep cultural and spiritual significance.

Each shrine within the Besease complex serves as a sacred abode for a specific spirit is known as "obosom," acting as an intermediary between mortals and the supreme deity, Nyame. As you explore this sacred site, marvel at the unique architecture that reflects the traditional beliefs and practices of ancestral worship. Immerse yourself in the atmosphere and observe the rituals and customs associated with venerating the ancient gods.

After this enriching experience, continue your journey and arrive in Accra. Check into your designated hotel,

where you can relax and unwind, reflecting on the day's memorable encounters and experiences.
