DAY 1 | 27 Oct, 2025

Depart New York [-/-/-]

Prepare yourself! You are leaving today for Cairo to start your magical journey to Egypt.

DAY 2 | 28 Oct, 2025

Cairo - Arrival [-/-/-]

Upon arrival in Cairo, claim your bags and proceed toward the arrival hall. Our representative will meet you and assist you with your transfer to the hotel. (Standard check-in time is 3:00 pm). Our local representative will assist you with a smooth check-in.

Check-in at the hotel and catch up on your rest. You can unwind or tour the city throughout the remaining part of the day.

Overnight in Cairo

DAY 3 | 29 Oct, 2025

Cairo (Pyramids, Sphinx Tour and Citadel) [B/L/-]

Begin your day at the iconic Giza Pyramid Complex, home to the last remaining wonder of the ancient world. Marvel at the Great Pyramid of Cheops, the largest and most impressive, then explore the Pyramid of Chephren and the smaller Pyramid of Menkaure, each showcasing ancient Egypt's architectural brilliance. Your expert guide will share insights into their construction and cultural significance. Next, visit the Great Sphinx, the monumental statue with the body of a lion and the head of a pharaoh, and uncover the mysteries surrounding this ancient guardian.

Afterward, head to Saladin Citadel, constructed by Salah al-Din on the Moqattam Hills in 1183 AD as a defence against Crusader armies. Known for its fresh air and sweeping views of Cairo, it is now a preserved historic site of mosques and museums, including the Mosque of Muhammad Ali Pasha.

Designed by the Turkish architect Yousif Boushnaq, who came to Cairo especially from Istanbul to build the great building, the mosque's alabaster structure stands in beautiful contrast to the sandstone city.

Enjoy a relaxing lunch at a local restaurant, savoring

authentic Egyptian cuisine. Afterward, you'll be transferred to your hotel, with the rest of the day free to enjoy at your leisure..

Overnight in Cairo

DAY 4 | 30 Oct, 2025

Cairo - Day trip to Alexandria (B/-/-)

After breakfast, take a full-day journey to the historic city of Alexandria and step back in time to explore its ancient wonders. After being picked up from your hotel in Cairo or Giza, you'll head toward Alexandria, with a stop along the way for a bathroom break and coffee.

Upon arrival, your tour begins with a visit to the Kom El-Deka Roman amphitheater, made of marble stone and once able to hold over 800 spectators. Explore the beautiful pleasure garden, Roman baths, and villas adorned with stunning mosaics.

Next, head to the Catacombs of Kom El Shoqafa, where you can marvel at the fusion of ancient Egyptian, Greek, and Roman architectural styles. Built in the second century AD, these catacombs remain one of the Seven Wonders of the Middle Ages.

Following that, visit Pompey's Pillar, the towering Roman triumphal column in Alexandria. Enjoy a tasty lunch at a local restaurant before stopping for a photo op outside the Library of Alexandria, once one of the most important libraries of the ancient world.

The tour wraps up with a visit to the Citadel of Qaitbay, perched above the ruins of the ancient Alexandria lighthouse. Afterward, you'll be driven back to Cairo dropped off at your hotel.

DAY 5 | 31 Oct, 2025

Cairo - Aswan - Nile Cruise [B/L/D]

Following your breakfast at the Cairo hotel, our representative will transport you to the airport for your flight to Aswan. Upon reaching Aswan, you will be escorted to the Cruise ship. Following check-in, indulge in a delicious lunch and then proceed to visit The High Dam. This dam was erected in 1960 AD by the Egyptian

president Gamal Abdel Nasser to protect Egypt from the flooding of the Nile River.

After that, you will board a motorboat and sail on the Nile to reach the Temple of Philae. This temple, dedicated to the goddess Isis, was constructed during the Graeco-Roman period. Your next stop will be The Unfinished Obelisk, which was created from red granite and was dedicated to the god Amun Ra. Once you've completed your tour, you will return to your Cruise ship. The rest of the evening is at your leisure to explore on your own.

You will have dinner and spend the night onboard the Cruise ship.

DAY 6 | 01 Nov, 2025

Aswan - Abu Simbel - Kom
Ombo - Edfu [B/L/D]

devoted to the deity Horus, before having breakfast. After that, the cruise ship will sail to Esna, where we will cross the famous floodgate. Once we reach Luxor, the grand city that was once the capital and known as Thebes, we will explore two of the most impressive temples in Egypt - the Luxor and Karnak temples, which were separated in ancient times by a three-kilometer-long avenue lined with Sphinxes. We will have lunch there and spend the night anchored in Luxor.

DAY 8 | 03 Nov, 2025

Luxor - Cairo [B/-/-]

After having breakfast and checking out, you will embark on a tour to explore the East Bank of Luxor. The tour includes visiting the impressive Karnak Temples Complex, which is renowned for being the largest construction of its kind globally, covering an area of one hundred acres. You will conclude the tour at the Temple of Luxor, constructed by a king from the 12th dynasty and completed by the famous king Ramses II. After finishing the tour, you will be taken to Luxor airport for your flight back to Cairo. Once you arrive in Cairo, you will be transported to your hotel, and the rest of the evening is yours to enjoy at your leisure. You can choose to visit the Khan el Khalili bazaar, which is the perfect spot for some last-minute souvenir shopping.

DAY 9 | 04 Nov, 2025

Cairo - Egyptian Museum, Old
Cairo and Khan El Khalili [B/L/-]

In the morning, you'll be picked up from your hotel in Cairo and taken to the National Museum of Egyptian Civilization. Your first stop will be the Egyptian Museum, home to a remarkable collection of artifacts from the Pharaonic era. The museum showcases over 5,000 years of art, making it the largest and most valuable collection of Egyptian art in the world. You'll see more than 250,000 authentic pieces, including an entire exhibit dedicated to the treasures, gold, and jewelry of Tutankhamun, which were sealed in his tomb for over 3,500 years before being uncovered in the 1920s.

Afterward, enjoy a delicious lunch at a local restaurant

where you can taste traditional Egyptian dishes. Then, head towards Old Cairo to explore key landmarks such as the Hanging Church (also known as Al-Muallaqa Church) and the Saints Sergius and Bacchus Church.

Next, visit the historic Khan El Khalili Bazaar, a bustling market where you can browse a variety of local handmade goods. After spending some time exploring the vibrant market, your full-day tour will conclude with a drop-off back at your hotel

DAY 10 | 05 Nov,
2025

Cairo - Amman [B/-/D]

Your incredible tour of Egypt comes to an end today. You will be transported to the airport for your flight to Amman. Upon arrival at Queen Alia International Airport in Jordan, you will receive assistance through all immigration procedures before embarking on a tour of Amman. During the tour, your guide will provide historical context for the city, which dates back to 3500 B.C. or earlier, and share insights into its past under the Roman Empire, Nabataeans, and Byzantines. You will visit notable attractions such as the King Abdullah Mosque, Parliament Building, and Orthodox Church, and explore the Amman Citadel with a private local guide. Here, you will discover ancient relics from Roman, Byzantine, and early Islamic times, including the Temple of Hercules and the Archaeological Museum. You will also see the Roman Amphitheater with its Hashemite Plaza, which could accommodate up to 6,000 spectators, and the Museum of Popular Traditions, which showcases traditional dress and jewelry. Additionally, you will have free time to explore downtown Amman's vibrant markets, traditional mosques, and churches, and stroll along Rainbow Street, Amman's colorful arts and shopping destination. Your day will end with a drop-off at your hotel or at one of the city's stylish malls, such as Galleria Mall, Taj Mall, or Abdali Boulevard.

Overnight in Amman

DAY 11 | 06 Nov,
2025

Amman - Petra [B/-/D]

After breakfast, embark on a scenic drive along the

King's Highway, an ancient road mentioned in the Bible that connects prehistoric villages from the Stone Age and biblical towns. Take a break at Madaba, also known as the City of Mosaics, located about 30 kilometers south of Amman. Here, visit the Greek Orthodox Church of St. George, which is home to the renowned 6th-century Byzantine mosaic map of holy sites in the biblical world. Next, head to Mount Nebo, which is believed to be the burial site of Moses and offers breathtaking views of the Holy Land from its 840-meter-high summit. Continuing along the King's Highway, reach the stunning Kerak Castle, one of the largest Crusader castles in the Levant, built in the 12th century AD. Located on a hilltop at an altitude of 1000 meters and surrounded by a valley on three sides, Kerak has been inhabited since the Iron Age and was an important city for the Moabites. Finally, arrive at Petra for an overnight stay at the hotel, where you can enjoy a delicious dinner in the evening.

DAY 12 | 07 Nov,
2025

Petra [B/-/D]

After breakfast, spend a full day exploring the stunning ancient city of Petra, often called the "Rose Red City." Recognized as one of the Seven Wonders of the World, Petra is a valuable treasure and top tourist destination in Jordan. Designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1985, Petra was built more than 2,000 years ago by the Nabateans, who carved impressive tombs, temples, palaces, and the famous Treasury monument, Al Khazneh, from the natural rose-colored rocks and sandstones of the desert. Begin your visit by walking or taking a short horse ride through the Siq, a narrow canyon that leads to the entrance of the old city. As you reach the end of the Siq, the stunning Treasury monument slowly comes into view. Petra was an important hub for trade routes linking the East and West, and your knowledgeable guide will lead you through this unique and extraordinary place, explaining its architectural and spiritual significance. Overnight in Petra after an enriching day of exploration.

DAY 13 | 08 Nov,
2025

Petra - Wadi Rum - Dead Sea
[B/-/D]

After breakfast, embark on a thrilling Bedouin 4X4 ride through the captivating Wadi Rum desert. This vast and echoing expanse of ancient valleys and towering sandstone mountains is a true desert gem, offering visitors an unforgettable experience of the desert's romantic allure. Wadi Rum is also home to several Bedouin tribes living in scattered camps and is a top destination for climbers due to its sheer granite and sandstone cliffs, and hikers for its vast open spaces. It is perhaps best known for its connection to the enigmatic British officer T.E. Lawrence, who was based here during the Great Arab Revolt of 1917-18, and for being the filming location for David Lean's Lawrence of Arabia.

In the afternoon, drive along the Wadi Araba Road towards the Dead Sea, located in the stunning Jordan Rift Valley, for some leisure time. Take a dip or float in the sea's mineral-rich waters, or treat yourself to a natural mud spa treatment from the Dead Sea's earth. The Dead Sea is a truly spectacular natural and spiritual landscape, with its unique location at the lowest point on Earth (423m below sea level) and flanked by mountains to the east and the rolling hills of Jerusalem to the west. Its incoming rivers, including the River Jordan, are landlocked and evaporate, leaving behind a dense and rich cocktail of salts and minerals that are highly valued in industry, agriculture, and medicine. The area is believed to have been home to five Biblical cities: Sodom, Gomorrah, Adman, Zebouin, and Zoar, adding to its otherworldly beauty and spiritual significance.

Overnight in the Dead Sea

DAY 14 | 09 Nov,
2025

Dead Sea [B/-/D]

You have a free day to relax and enjoy the beauty and benefits of the Dead Sea. Swim or float in the sea's therapeutic waters, which are rich in minerals and salts, or indulge in a spa treatment using the natural mud from the Dead Sea. You can also take a stroll along the shores of the sea and enjoy the stunning landscapes, surrounded by mountains to the east and rolling hills of Jerusalem to the west. The area is known for its peacefulness and serenity, offering a perfect environment for relaxation and contemplation. If you're

feeling more adventurous, you can explore nearby attractions such as ancient ruins, and nature reserves, or visit the nearby town of Madaba, known as the "City of Mosaics."

Add-on: Half day trip to Bethany- USD 100 Per person

This afternoon continues to the Baptism Site Bethany Area where John the Baptist baptized Jesus. Known in Arabic as Al-Maghtas, the Baptism Site has been identified by archaeologists as the place where John the Baptist preached, where Jesus was baptized by John, where the first five apostles met and thus where the foundations of the early Christian faith were laid. Jesus is said to have come here en-route from Galilee and Umm Qais and is believed to have spent three days here before heading off to spend 40 days in the nearby wilderness. John was later arrested and beheaded by Herod at Machaerus, also in Jordan

Overnight in the Dead Sea

DAY 15 | 10 Nov,
2025

Dead Sea - Jerash - Ajloun -
Amman Departure [B/-/-]

Following breakfast, depart at 10:00 AM to the ancient Roman city of Jerash for a half-day tour. Known as the Jewel of the North, Jerash is one of the largest and best-preserved Roman architecture sites outside of Italy. It has a rich history, with human habitation dating back over 6,500 years. During Roman rule, Jerash reached its golden age and is now widely regarded as one of the best-preserved Roman provincial towns in the world. After being buried in sand for centuries, the city was excavated and restored over the past 70 years, revealing grand, formal provincial Roman urbanism. Visitors can admire paved and colonnaded streets, hilltop temples, impressive theaters, public squares and plazas, baths, fountains, and city walls with towers and gates.

After exploring Jerash, continue on to Ajloun for a visit to Ajloun Castle. Located 28km from Jerash and 76km northwest of Amman, Ajloun is a hilly town renowned for its remarkable ruins and the 12th-century fortress, Ajloun Castle, built by Saladin's nephew. Finally, you will be driven to Amman International Airport for your return flight home. Thank you for choosing to travel with us.
