DAY 3 | 10 Jun, 2026

Lima - Full day Lima sightseeing including Larco Museum [B/L/-]

Next, we'll head to the San Francisco Convent, a 17th-century landmark, and explore its intriguing "Catacombs," an ancient underground cemetery. Our final stop will be the Larco Museum, which showcases over 3,000 years of pre-Columbian Peruvian history. The museum features an impressive collection of gold and silver jewelry and religious artifacts that highlight the exceptional craftsmanship of ancient Peruvian artisans. Additionally, the museum houses a renowned collection of erotic ceramic art that provides a fascinating glimpse into pre-Columbian sexuality. To round off the day, enjoy a delicious lunch at the Café del Museo

Restaurant.

Enjoy an evening of Peruvian dance performances and the elegance of Peruvian Paso horses at a delightful dinner show. Explore 13 neoclassical-style fountains, including one with a spectacular jet reaching 80 meters in height. Gain insight into this Monumental Urban Environment, designed by French architect Claude Sahut. Savor a delicious Peruvian buffet dinner at Hacienda de Paso. Experience captivating dances representing three regions of Peru and witness the impressive skills of Peruvian Paso horses in the show. After the evening's festivities, return to your accommodation in Barranco.

DAY 4 | 11 Jun, 2026

Lima - Cusco - Sacred Valley [B/L/-]

After a delightful breakfast, you'll be smoothly transferred from your hotel to Lima Airport for your flight to Cusco. Once you arrive in Cusco, a representative will be there to welcome you. We'll then continue our journey to the Sacred Valley, situated 17.4 miles (28 km) from Cusco.

Along the way, we'll visit the Manos de la Comunidad Center, where you'll gain insight into the diverse camelids native to the Andes, including Llamas, Alpacas, Vicuñas, and Guanacos. You'll also have the opportunity to learn about traditional textile art techniques from local artisans.

Our next stop will be Hacienda Sarapampa for lunch, where you'll explore the legacy of a family deeply rooted in the Sacred Valley for three generations. Discover their work with Cusco's distinctive giant white corn, a special crop unique to this region.

After lunch, we'll head to Pisac, a delightful town where Inca and colonial heritage blend beautifully into everyday life. Stroll through this charming town, known for its lively craft markets, and shop for fine ceramics, textiles, and jewelry.

Finally, you'll check into your hotel and enjoy its amenities. Due to the high altitude, we suggest using the rest of the day to relax and acclimate.

Overnight in Sacred Valley

DAY 5 | 12 Jun, 2026

Sacred Valley - Full day Sacred valley tour including Community of Corccor [B/L/-]

Today, you'll embark on a full-day excursion to the Sacred Valley of the Incas. We'll start early in the morning with a trip to Lake Piuray in Chinchero. Upon arrival, you'll be warmly greeted by friendly villagers, accompanied by traditional music and dance.

Following this warm welcome, you'll have the chance to engage in various activities and experience a unique moment in a rural community that has preserved its pre-Hispanic customs. The villagers will open their doors to you, sharing their way of life, beliefs, traditions, and culture.

After our visit, a private vehicle will be ready to take us back to Lake Piuray, where we'll enjoy a picnic lunch amidst stunning scenery. Post lunch return back to your hotel and relax.

Add-on: Afternoon Mara's Salt Pans and Moray Archaeological Site - USD 120 Per person (minimum 6 pax)

We'll cross the Urubamba River and make our way to the Salt Pans of Maras. You'll be struck by the striking contrast of the bright white salt pans, which have been in operation since Incan times, set against the lush green mountain slopes.

Our adventure will then take us to the archaeological site of Moray. This site, used for agricultural experimentation, features a series of circular terraces that descend 490 feet (150 meters) from our vantage point. These terraces are a remarkable example of the Incan ability to create sophisticated structures in harmony with their natural environment.

Overnight in Sacred Valley

DAY 6 | 13 Jun, 2026

Sacred Valley - Machu Picchu - Cusco [B/L/-]

In the early morning, you'll be transferred to the train station for your journey to Machu Picchu, the 'Lost City of the Incas' (7,900 feet). This mountaintop fortress, which functioned as both a place of worship and an astronomical observatory, is nestled in the cloud forest overlooking the Urubamba River. Upon arrival, you'll enter the archaeological zone, where a tour guide will highlight the key areas of this magnificent Inca city, including the impressive Intiwatana (solar clock) and the Sun Temple. Machu Picchu is divided into two main sections: the urban area to the north and the agricultural sector to the southeast.

Machu Picchu, once considered a legend, was rediscovered in 1911 by explorer Hiram Bingham. Situated 2,430 meters above sea level in a breathtaking tropical mountain forest, it stands as one of the most remarkable achievements of the Inca Empire at its peak. The intricate stonework, with its giant walls, terraces, and ramps, appears as though it has been naturally sculpted from the rock face. After exploring, you'll enjoy a delicious lunch at a local restaurant.

Following lunch, we'll take a bus back to Aguas Calientes and then board the train to Poroy rail station. Upon arrival you will be greeted and transferred to your hotel in Cusco.

Overnight in Cusco

DAY 7 | 14 Jun, 2026

Cusco - Sightseeing [B/-/]

After breakfast, meet your guide and set out to discover some of Cusco's lesser-known sights. We will explore the Fortress of Sacsayhuaman, an impressive structure renowned for its massive carved stones fitted with remarkable precision. This extraordinary example of Incan military architecture is considered one of the greatest achievements of the Tahuantinsuyo.

Next, we'll make a brief stop at the Qoricancha, meaning "room of gold" in Quechua. This temple was dedicated to the Sun god, and legend has it that its interior walls were once covered entirely in gold.

We'll then stroll through Hatun Rumiyoq, a narrow Inca street famous for its precise arrangement of large stones. It is believed to have been the palace of the sixth Inca king, Inca Roca. Be sure to admire a particularly notable stone with twelve perfectly fitted angles.

Finally, we'll visit the Cusco Cathedral to uncover its secrets and appreciate its beautiful atriums and invaluable 17th and 18th-century paintings from the Cusco school.

The rest of the day is free for you to explore at your leisure.

Overnight in Cusco

DAY 8 | 15 Jun, 2026

Cusco - Puno [B/L/-]

After breakfast, we'll proceed on our journey to Puno. En route, we'll make a short stop at the Church of Andahuaylillas, which dates back to the early 17th century. Often referred to as the "Sistine Chapel of South America," it is famous for its exquisite paintings and a gold-adorned altar.

Covering a distance of 218 km, we'll arrive at Raqchi to explore the Inca Temple of Wiracocha. This temple complex includes a main building that was used by the Inca and additional structures for the nobility. The most notable building within the complex is the Wiracocha temple, an architectural marvel classified as Kallanka. This structure, which was traditionally covered with straw (wood and "ichu"), measures 92 meters in length and 25.25 meters in width.

Next, we'll visit Pucará to explore the Lithic Museum, which provides a fascinating overview of Andean culture from its earliest inhabitants to the Incas. Following our time in Pucará, we'll travel through expansive high Andean plateaus, renowned for their breathtaking and clear views.

The reflections of the sun on the region's lakes and rivers are truly spectacular. Finally, we'll arrive in the city of Puno, where you'll be dropped off at your hotel in the historic center. Situated between the shores of Lake Titicaca and the surrounding mountains, Puno serves as the gateway to the renowned floating islands of the Uros, an impressive archipelago of Titora islands inhabited by the Uros people, descendants of one of the continent's oldest cultures.

Overnight in Puno

DAY 9 | 16 Jun, 2026

Puno - Day free at leisure [B/-/]

Enjoy a day to explore Puno at your own pace. You have the freedom to relax, wander through the city, or delve into its vibrant culture. Discover local attractions, shop for souvenirs, or savor traditional Peruvian cuisine at a nearby restaurant.

Consider visiting the famous floating islands of the Uros or take a leisurely stroll along the shores of Lake Titicaca. With its unique blend of natural beauty and rich cultural heritage, Puno offers plenty of opportunities for exploration and relaxation.

Add-on: Full day Titicaca Lake, Uros Islands and Taquile Island tour - USD 120 Per person (minimum 6 pax)

We'll first visit the Uros floating islands, a unique collection of approximately 40 small islands made entirely from totora reeds, which grow around the lake. We'll then continue our cruise over the serene lake

waters to Taquile Island, a charming destination where ancient Quechua traditions harmoniously blend with modern life. The island features distinct Incan terraces adorned with local flowers and crops. We'll be captivated by the vibrant colors of the local attire and the exquisite handmade textiles. The warm hospitality of the Taquileños will make our visit truly unforgettable. Before returning to Puno, we will enjoy a meal at a local home.

Overnight in Puno

DAY 10 | 17 Jun, 2026 Puno - Juliaca - Lima [B/-/-]

Enjoy your breakfast and you will be transferred to Juliaca airport for your flight to Lima. Upon arrival in Lima, you will be transferred to your hotel. The rest of the day is free to explore Lima at your own pace. You can take this opportunity to relax, discover the city's vibrant neighborhoods, or delve into its rich cultural offerings. Whether you choose to visit local attractions, dine at a variety of restaurants, or simply soak in the atmosphere, the day is yours to enjoy as you please.

Overnight in Lima

Next, head to the Olive Trees Park in the San Isidro district. Enjoy the tranquility of this serene green space, home to centuries-old olive trees. Then visit Love Park, where you can celebrate love in all its forms. Don't miss the chance to photograph "The Kiss," a famous sculpture by renowned Peruvian artist Victor Delfin, and admire the picturesque surroundings from the tiled benches inspired by Antoni Gaudí's Parc Güell in Barcelona.

Continue your journey with breathtaking views of Lima and the Pacific Ocean from the cliffs of Miraflores. Finally, explore Barranco, Lima's artistic neighborhood, known for its stunning murals and the charming Bridge of Sighs where you can make a wish.

Late evening you will be transferred to airport for your return flight home
