This tour of Atlantic Canada offers a perfect blend of coastal beauty, cultural exploration, and relaxed pacing. Begin in Halifax, Nova Scotia, with its lively waterfront and historic Citadel, then venture to the iconic Peggy's Cove and UNESCO-listed Lunenburg. Discover the lush Annapolis Valley and the scallop-rich town of Digby before experiencing the world-famous tides of the Bay of Fundy and Hopewell Rocks in New Brunswick. Explore Fundy National Park's scenic trails and Moncton's cultural attractions, then cross the Confederation Bridge to Prince Edward Island to visit the literary landmark of Green Gables and vibrant Charlottetown. The journey concludes with a visit to Cape Breton Island's charming Baddeck, home to the Alexander Graham Bell National Historic Site, before returning to Halifax for departure.

# ITINERARY

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## DAY 1 HALIFAX - CITY EXPLORATION [-/-/D]

Your journey begins in Halifax, the vibrant capital of Nova Scotia, where you'll arrive and settle into the rhythm of Atlantic Canada. After checking into your hotel, spend the afternoon strolling along the Halifax Waterfront, a lively promenade lined with shops, restaurants, and historic ships. Take in the maritime atmosphere as you explore the boardwalk, enjoying views of the harbor and perhaps spotting local street performers. Later, visit the Halifax Citadel National Historic Site, a star-shaped fortress perched above the city, where you can immerse yourself in Nova Scotia's military history and enjoy panoramic views of the city skyline. The day concludes with free time to relax or explore nearby pubs and restaurants, soaking in Halifax's welcoming vibe.

## DAY 2 COASTAL CHARM OF PEGGY'S COVE AND LUNENBURG [B/L/-]

After breakfast, embark on a breathtaking coastal drive southwest of Halifax to Peggy's Cove, one of Canada's most photographed locations. The journey itself offers spectacular seaside vistas and quaint fishing hamlets along the Lighthouse Route. Upon arrival, marvel at the Peggy's Point Lighthouse, dramatically perched atop smooth, wave-worn granite rocks. Take time to wander through the fishing village, where brightly painted houses, lobster traps, and fishing boats create a postcard-perfect setting. Visit local artisans' studios or enjoy a coffee overlooking the rugged Atlantic coastline.

Continue your scenic drive along the South Shore to Mahone Bay, famous for its trio of iconic waterfront churches and charming boutiques. Pause for lunch at a cozy café offering fresh local seafood. Then proceed to Lunenburg, a UNESCO World Heritage Site known for its well-preserved 18th-century British colonial architecture. Stroll through its colorful streets, visit the Fisheries Museum of the Atlantic, and admire the Bluenose II, a replica of the legendary racing schooner. In the late afternoon, enjoy free time to explore shops or relax at a harbor-view café before returning to

Halifax.

## DAY 3 ANNAPOLIS VALLEY AND DIGBY [B/-/D]

This morning, journey west into the fertile Annapolis Valley, a region of orchards, vineyards, and rolling farmland nestled between two mountain ranges. Begin your day at a local winery, where you'll learn about Nova Scotia's cool-climate wines and enjoy a guided tasting paired with local cheese or fruit. Continue to Wolfville, a lively university town known for its artistic flair and farm-to-table dining. Take a short walk along the Harvest Moon Trail for lovely countryside views before stopping for lunch at a bistro featuring regional ingredients.

In the afternoon, travel toward the coastal town of Digby, famed as the "Scallop Capital of the World." Along the way, stop at the historic Annapolis Royal, one of Canada's oldest European settlements. Visit Fort Anne National Historic Site, where centuries of history come alive through exhibits and preserved ramparts. Upon arrival in Digby, enjoy free time to stroll the picturesque waterfront and watch fishing boats unload their daily catch. Conclude the day with a seafood dinner featuring fresh Digby scallops.

## DAY 4 BAY OF FUNDY AND SAINT JOHN [B/L/-]

After breakfast, depart Digby and travel toward the breathtaking Bay of Fundy, home to the highest tides on Earth. Cross into New Brunswick and stop at the famous Hopewell Rocks, where massive sandstone formations—known as "flowerpot rocks"—stand like sentinels along the coast. At low tide, you can walk along the ocean floor among these towering natural sculptures; at high tide, the same area transforms into a dramatic seascape. Take time to explore the interpretive center to learn about the region's unique geology and ecosystem.

Enjoy lunch en route, then continue to Saint John, the oldest incorporated city in Canada, located on the Bay

of Fundy. Upon arrival, explore the Saint John City Market, a vibrant marketplace dating back to the 19th century, filled with local delicacies, artisan crafts, and friendly vendors. Later, visit Reversing Falls Rapids, a fascinating natural phenomenon where the tides force the Saint John River to flow backward. End your day with a leisurely walk along Market Square and the waterfront boardwalk, perhaps sampling local cuisine or live music before retiring for the night.

## DAY 5 FUNDY NATIONAL PARK AND MONCTON [B/-/D]

This morning, journey to Fundy National Park, a sanctuary of forests, waterfalls, and rugged coastline. Begin with a gentle hike on the Dickson Falls Trail, a scenic loop that leads through lush moss-covered forest to a cascading waterfall. Keep your camera ready for glimpses of local wildlife such as songbirds or white-tailed deer. If time permits, stop at Point Wolfe or Herring Cove for panoramic coastal views of the Fundy shoreline.

After lunch, continue to Moncton, known as the “Hub City” of the Maritimes. Along the way, stop at Cape Enrage to view dramatic cliffs and a historic lighthouse offering sweeping views of the Bay of Fundy. Upon arrival in Moncton, explore Centennial Park, a green urban oasis, or experience the optical illusion at Magnetic Hill, where cars appear to roll uphill on their own. In the evening, enjoy a group dinner highlighting regional cuisine before unwinding at your hotel.

## DAY 6 PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND AND CHARLOTTETOWN [B/L/-]

After breakfast, drive across the impressive Confederation Bridge, an engineering marvel spanning 12.9 km (8 miles) to Prince Edward Island. Your first stop is Cavendish, home to the Green Gables Heritage Place, where the beloved world of Anne of Green Gables comes to life. Explore the farmhouse that inspired the novel, stroll through the Haunted Woods Trail, and immerse yourself in the island’s literary history.

Next, enjoy lunch at a local café serving PEI specialties such as mussels or lobster rolls before continuing to Charlottetown, the island’s charming capital and the birthplace of Canadian Confederation. Take a guided walking tour through the historic downtown, featuring landmarks like Province House, St. Dunstan’s Basilica, and Victoria Row, lined with cafés and boutiques. In the evening, you may opt to attend a local musical performance or enjoy a relaxed dinner featuring PEI’s renowned potatoes and seafood.

## DAY 7 CAPE BRETON ISLAND AND BADDECK [B/-/D]

Depart Charlottetown after breakfast and journey back to Nova Scotia, crossing the Canso Causeway to Cape Breton Island, famed for its rugged beauty and Celtic heritage. Continue to the lakeside village of Baddeck, the gateway to the Cabot Trail. Visit the Alexander Graham Bell National Historic Site, where interactive exhibits showcase Bell’s pioneering inventions in communication and aviation, along with his experiments conducted on nearby Bras d’Or Lake.

In the afternoon, take a relaxing stroll through Baddeck’s waterfront, browsing local artisan shops or enjoying coffee with a view of the lake’s calm waters. For those seeking a bit of adventure, optional activities include a short boat cruise on Bras d’Or Lake or a visit to the Uisge Ban Falls trail for a gentle nature walk. Conclude your day with a traditional Cape Breton dinner and perhaps live local music, reflecting the island’s vibrant Gaelic culture.

## DAY 8 DEPARTURE - HALIFAX [B/-/-]

Begin your final day with a scenic drive from Baddeck back to Halifax, enjoying the picturesque landscapes of Cape Breton Island along the way. Depending on your departure time, you may have a few hours in Halifax to visit a local café, browse artisan shops, or take a final stroll along the waterfront. Transfer to the airport for your departure, concluding a memorable journey through Atlantic Canada’s coastal wonders, cultural gems, and charming villages.
