DAY 3 Accra (City tour with visit to Traditional African Market) [B/-/D]

After enjoying your breakfast, embark on an informative sightseeing excursion of Accra, the capital city of Ghana. This orientation tour provides an opportunity to explore the highlights of Accra, a city that has served as Ghana's capital since 1877 and remains the bustling hub of the Greater Accra Region, as well as the country's most populous city.

Conclude the day's tour at the Arts Center, a vibrant

open-air market where you can practice your bargaining skills while shopping for a wide array of goods sourced from Ghana and other West African countries. DAY 5 Accra - Canopy Walk Way & Kakum Rain Forest - Slave Dungeon Experience (Cape Coast Castle) [B/-/D]

Following your breakfast, begin your journey towards Cape Coast, passing through the historically significant Denkyira Kingdom, a region with a rich past. Continue onwards to Kakum National Park, a remarkable testament to the preservation of West Africa's tropical rainforests. Here, you'll have the choice between two captivating activities. You can opt for a 2-kilometer

nature walk through the lush rainforest, where you'll have the opportunity to encounter a diverse array of extraordinary plant and animal species and learn about their medicinal properties. Alternatively, you can embark on an exhilarating stroll along the canopy walkway, suspended 40 meters above the forest floor, offering breathtaking views.

After enjoying lunch at your own leisure, embark on a poignant tour of the infamous forts, castles, and slave dungeons that bear witness to Ghana's dark past. Unfold the pages of history as you delve into the harrowing story of the transatlantic slave trade, whose repercussions are still felt far beyond the African shores to this day. Your first stop will be the Cape Coast Castle, originally built by the Swedes in 1653 and later seized by the British. Here, you will gain insight into the intricate relationship between the Western slave traders and the African tribes that facilitated the transatlantic slave trade. Step inside the castle's dim and suffocating dungeons, and let your imagination transport you back in time, allowing you to empathize with the millions of Africans who endured unimaginable suffering. The castle also houses the West African Historical Museum, providing further historical context and artifacts for exploration.

DAY 6

Cape Coast - (Fishing Village - Slave Dungeon (Elmina Castle)) [B/-/D]
