ITINERARY

DAY 1 Depart USA/CANADA [-/-/-]

Prepare yourself! You are leaving today for Santiago to start your unbelievable mysteries of Easter Island and Wonders of South America Tour.

DAY 2 Santiago Arrival [-/-/-]

Chile's dynamic capital, Santiago, rises from the foothills of the Andes, offering a lively mix of traditional markets, museums, art galleries, top-tier restaurants, and theaters. Surrounded by the stunning, snow-covered Andes, it boasts one of the most breathtaking natural settings of any city.

Upon arrival at Santiago Airport, you'll be warmly greeted and transferred to your hotel (standard check-in time is 3:00 PM). After checking in, you can rest and recharge or You can explore the city's vibrant nightlife, relax at a café, or take in the beautiful evening views of the Andes

Overnight in Santiago

DAY 3 Santiago - Sightseeing [B/-/-]

After breakfast, depart from your hotel and start with a tour of the historic center, visiting landmarks like Plaza de Armas, the Cathedral, and the heart of the city, where Santiago's colonial origins began. Next, we'll explore the civic district, home to the ministerial buildings and the presidential palace, "La Moneda." We'll then head to the eastern part of the city, where you'll experience Santiago's modern side, with striking architectural contrasts and impressive contemporary buildings that define the city's growth. Finally, we'll return to your hotel.

Overnight in Santiago

DAY 4 Santiago - Flight to Easter Island [B/-/-]

After breakfast, you will be transferred to Santiago Airport to catch a five-hour flight from Santiago to

Easter Island, the most remote inhabited island in the world, famous for the mysterious Moai statues—monolithic stone heads crafted by an ancient civilization. Upon arrival, you'll be welcomed before being transferred to your hotel. The rest of the day is free for you to explore Hanga Roa, the island's main town.

Overnight in Easter Island

DAY 5 Easter Island - Morning Orongo Tour and afternoon Ahu Akivi [B/-/-]

Depart from your hotel in Hanga Roa village for a tour that combines rich history with breathtaking views of one of Rapa Nui's most stunning and deepest volcanoes. The journey begins at the VINAPU archaeological site, where stone structures showcase the native techniques for working with volcanic rock. You'll also see remnants of Moai statues, toppled during the 18th-century clan wars. Next, visit the ceremonial village of ORONGO, the site of the Tangata Manu competition, or "Bird Man," which determined which clan would rule the island for the year. The tour concludes at the RANO KAU Volcano viewpoint, offering a view of the island's natural sanctuary within the crater. ***Note: The tour excludes a visit to the Ana Kai Tangata cave due to potential landslide risks.

Return to your hotel and later this afternoon, Leave your hotel in Hanga Roa village for a tour that begins with a visit to Ahu Akivi, one of the rare platforms where the Moai statues face the sea. This site features seven statues, symbolizing the seven explorers sent by King Hotu Matu'a before his settlement journey. Afterward, we'll head to Uri a Urenga and Puna Pau, a small red volcanic crater where the "Pukao" (hats or crowns) for the Moai statues were crafted. The tour concludes with a return to your hotel.

Overnight on Easter Island

DAY 6 Easter Island- Anakena visti including Lunch [B/L/-]

Depart from your hotel in Hanga Roa village for a tour starting at Ahu Akivi, one of the few platforms where Moai statues face the ocean. This site is home to seven

statues, representing the explorers sent by King Hotu Matu'a before his settlement expedition. Next, we'll visit Uri a Urenga and Puna Pau, a small red volcanic crater where the "Pukao" (hats or crowns) for the Moai were made. The tour wraps up with a return to your hotel.

Overnight in Easter Island

DAY 7 Easter Island - Flight to Santiago [B/-/-]

Depending on your flight time, have a final chance to enjoy the island before you catch your transfer to the airport for your flight back to Santiago, where you stay in an airport hotel.

Overnight in Santiago

DAY 8 Santiago - Buenos Aires [B/-/-]

After an early breakfast, you'll be transferred to the airport for your flight to Buenos Aires. Upon arrival, you will be greeted at the airport and escorted to your hotel. Buenos Aires, the capital of Argentina, is a vibrant city blending European charm with a distinct Latin American flair. Famous for its cuisine, rich cultural heritage, and as the birthplace of tango, the city offers an abundance of attractions to explore.

Overnight in Buenos Aires

DAY 9 Buenos Aires - City Sightseeing [B/-/-]

After breakfast, depart from your hotel and take a drive along "9 de Julio," the world's widest avenue, passing the stunning Colón Theatre, an iconic opera house. Continue on to Plaza de Mayo, home to the Government House and the original City Hall. Here, step inside the Metropolitan Cathedral to marvel at its grand ceilings, impressive stained glass, marble columns, and artwork. Next, head to the colorful La Boca district, where you can enjoy a brief walk down "Caminito," filled with souvenir shops and vibrant tango dancers. On the way, you'll also pass by the famous Boca Juniors soccer stadium before heading to the Puerto Madero area, a trendy district built on repurposed docks, known for its excellent restaurants. As you drive through Palermo, take in the lush parks and green spaces before arriving at the chic Recoleta

neighborhood. Your tour concludes with a visit to the Recoleta Cemetery, founded in 1822 and renowned worldwide. This historic cemetery is the final resting place of many national heroes, presidents, celebrated writers, scientists, and artists. Explore its elaborate mausoleums, sculptures, and vaults created by both local and international artists, and make sure to stop by Eva Perón's grave.

Rest of the day is free for you to enjoy at your own pace in Buenos Aires. You can explore the city's charming neighborhoods, perhaps visit the trendy shops and cafes of Palermo, or relax in one of the city's beautiful parks. If you're feeling adventurous, you could explore the art galleries in the vibrant San Telmo district. Alternatively, take some time to simply unwind at a local café, enjoy a cup of coffee, and watch the world go by. The possibilities are endless!

Overnight in Buenos Aires

DAY 10 Buenos Aires - Morning Tigre and Parana Delta tour, evening Dinner with Tango Show [B/-/D]

After breakfast, depart your hotel and drive 33 km (21 miles) north to the outskirts of Buenos Aires. Tigre, a favored weekend escape for many locals, is known for its charming summer residences, as well as its yacht and rowing clubs. Upon reaching Tigre, board a comfortable boat for a 1-hour shared excursion along the Paraná Delta, where you'll explore its channels, rivers, streams, and numerous islands, surrounded by lush vegetation.

During this scenic journey, you'll have the chance to discover the natural beauty of one of the largest deltas in the world. Cruise along the five main rivers of the Paraná Delta, and enjoy the tranquil atmosphere as you pass by picturesque islands dotted with homes, schools, and churches, offering a true taste of local life.

The "5 Rivers Tour" is an ideal way to experience the Tigre Delta. In just an hour, you'll pass by rowing clubs, the Parque de la Costa amusement park, the Tigre City Hall, the famous Tigre Art Museum (formerly the "Tigre Hotel"), and the Sarmiento Museum. By the end of the tour, you'll have a deeper understanding of the unique island lifestyle, witnessing how locals live, work, and play in this beautiful area.

Return to your hotel and Relax.

Later this evening, at the designated time, you'll be picked up from your hotel and transferred to a tango house to enjoy a delightful dinner and an unforgettable tango show.

No trip to Buenos Aires is complete without experiencing a live tango performance. Originating in the late 19th century in the city's working-class neighborhoods, tango blends several musical rhythms. Initially danced only by men, its music featured instruments like flutes, violins, and guitars. Over time, the flutes were replaced by the "bandoneón" (a type of accordion), giving tango its signature sound, made famous by legendary musicians such as Astor Piazzolla and Aníbal Troilo. After savoring a delicious dinner and watching an incredible tango performance at one of the city's renowned tango houses, you'll return to your hotel around midnight.

Overnight in Buenos Aires

DAY 11

Buenos Aires - Flight to Iguazu, Argentinian Falls tour [B/-/-]

After an early breakfast, check out and head to the airport for your flight to Iguazu Falls.

Upon arriving in Iguazu, you'll make your way directly to the Argentinian National Park, where you'll be surrounded by lush jungle and the powerful waterfalls. This side of the falls offers close-up views from pathways that run alongside the water. Your visit includes the iconic Devil's Throat, the largest waterfall in the park. Take the train to the Upper Circuit (1,700m), where you can enjoy panoramic views of the falls. Arriving at Devil's Throat, you'll witness its awe-inspiring power—150 meters (492 feet) long and 80 meters (262 feet) high, its horseshoe shape creates a breathtaking cascade. From there, walk about 3 km (1.87 miles) along the Iguazú River canyon to the Lower Circuit (1,500m), where you'll encounter vibrant local fauna and flora, all while feeling the constant roar of the waterfalls.

Afterwards, drive to your hotel, either on the Argentine or Brazilian side of the falls. Once you've checked in, take the rest of the evening to relax and unwind.

Overnight in Iguazu Falls (Brazil)

DAY 12

Iguazu Falls - Brazilian Side [B/-/-]

This morning, you'll explore Iguazu Falls from the Brazilian side, which offers the best vantage points for taking in the full scale of the falls. From the walkways, you'll enjoy sweeping panoramic views of all 275 falls, stretching an impressive mile across.

Leave your hotel in Brazil and drive to the Iguassu National Park. Once there, take a leisurely walk along the paths, surrounded by lush vegetation, vibrant butterflies, and cascading waterfalls. Follow the 1.5 km (1 mile) trail leading to a spectacular panoramic view of Devil's Throat. From this viewpoint, you'll be able to appreciate the stunning views of other notable Argentine sites, such as the Two Sisters and Bozzeti waterfalls, the Superior Circuit, and San Martin Island—famous for being the filming location of the movie "The Mission."

Add-on: Macuco Safari Tour - USD

From the entrance of the National Park, hop aboard a rustic open wagon for a ride along the Macuco Trail. Enjoy unobstructed views of the lush jungle, home to vibrant orchids and fluttering butterflies. Your guide will share fascinating stories and myths about the subtropical forest. Afterward, deepen your connection with nature as you walk into the heart of the Brazilian jungle, following the canyon trail to reach the Macuco Falls. Your adventure concludes with a thrilling ride in an inflatable boat, navigating through gentle rapids to get up close and personal with the stunning views from beneath the falls.

****Note:**

This is a shared tour with other international travelers. For the border crossing, travelers must have their passports and any necessary visas. Please note that you will get wet during the tour! We recommend bringing a bathing suit, comfortable clothes, tennis shoes, insect repellent, a waterproof camera, and a towel. Wheelchair access is not available. The Macuco Safari tour runs Monday to Friday from 09:00 AM to 4:40 PM, and Saturday to Sunday from 08:30 AM to 4:40 PM.

DAY 13

Iguazu Falls - Flight to Rio de Janeiro [B/-/-]

Today after breakfast, check-out and depart from Puerto Iguazu Airport for your flight to Rio de Janeiro. Colorful, tropical, and full of energy, Rio de Janeiro stands out as one of South America's most captivating destinations. Surrounded by lush mountains and bordered by pristine white-sand beaches, the city's natural beauty is unparalleled. Combine this with Rio's lively party scene, and it becomes one of the most exciting and enticing places to visit in the world.

Upon arrival, you will be met and transported to your hotel. The remainder of the day is yours to independently explore Brazil's lively party capital.

Overnight in Rio De Janeiro

DAY 14

Rio De Janeiro - Sugar Loaf, History and Culture tour [B/L/-]

Depart from your hotel and drive through the Copacabana neighborhood, heading to your next stop at Urca Station. From there, take two cable cars to ascend the towering granite rocks of Sugar Loaf Mountain. Enjoy breathtaking views of the lush landscape surrounding this iconic natural landmark. The journey to the top involves two cable car rides—one to the shorter Morro da Urca and then to the summit of Sugar Loaf. The Swiss-made, bubble-shaped cars provide 360° panoramic views, offering glimpses of the city, the open sea, and Guanabara Bay. After soaking in the stunning vistas, enjoy lunch at a restaurant.

Post lunch, experience, blending historical sites, cultural immersion, and iconic landmarks, ensuring an enriching visit to Rio de Janeiro. Begin your journey at Praça XV, a historic square that has been central to Rio since its early days, surrounded by colonial-era buildings that reflect the city's deep history.

A short walk from Praça XV takes you to Arco Teles, a charming narrow street with a picturesque archway, known for its vibrant atmosphere and historic architecture, perfect for a leisurely stroll. Continue your exploration to the beautiful Nossa Senhora da Lapa dos Mercadores Church, a stunning example of architectural craftsmanship located in Rio's historical district.

Next, head to the Centro Cultural Banco do Brasil (CCBB), a cultural hub that hosts a variety of

exhibitions and artistic events. Admire the grandeur of the Candelária Church, known for its neoclassical design and significance in Rio's religious history. Visit the Monastery of St. Benedict, renowned for its exquisite baroque architecture and rich interior, followed by the Real Gabinete Português de Leitura, a striking Portuguese library featuring Gothic Revival architecture.

Take a brief photo stop at the famous Colombo Bakery, an opulent establishment with Belle Époque decor, offering a glimpse of Rio's historical café culture. Continue the tour to the striking Metropolitan Cathedral, a modern, cylindrical marvel with impressive stained-glass windows and a vast interior, standing out on Rio's skyline.

Finally, visit the colorful Selarón Steps, an iconic site adorned with thousands of vibrant tiles from around the world, perfect for capturing memorable photos. After this captivating tour of Rio's historical and cultural landmarks, we will return you to your hotel.

Enjoy the scenic journey, surrounded by lush rainforest and beautiful views. Upon reaching the summit, take in the iconic Christ the Redeemer statue, one of the Seven Wonders of the World. From this privileged viewpoint, enjoy breathtaking panoramic views of Rio de Janeiro and its surroundings. Afterward, descend and conclude your tour with visits to the famous white-sand beaches of Copacabana, Ipanema, and Leblon before returning to your hotel.

Rest of the afternoon take your time to discover this captivating city at your own pace. Enjoy a day of leisurely strolls through the streets of Rio, taking in the breathtaking backdrop. Consider sampling local dishes and delicacies at one of the numerous restaurants or coffee houses. Since Copacabana is renowned as the most famous beach in the world, your trip to Rio wouldn't be complete without spending some time immersing yourself in Copacabana's beach culture, all while sipping on the national drink, the "Caipirinha".
